Marine Straddlelift and Forklift Operator Training

ABBRA to offer two courses in Charleston, South Carolina on March 1, 2011

Warren, RI—The American Boat Builders & Repairers Association (ABBRA) with the Charleston City Boatyard will be offering two courses in Charleston, South Carolina on March 1, 2011. A [Marine Equipment Operator Training](#) (MEOT) in Marine Straddlelift is scheduled for the morning, and a Marine Forklift Training will be available to MEOT participants that afternoon.

“We’re offering these training courses in March for ABBRA members and non-members,” Doug Domenie, president of ABBRA, says. “Our Marine Equipment Operator Training has always been a popular course and hosting it with the help of the Charleston City Boatyard is a great way to offer people convenient access to low-cost training”

ABBRA’s MEOT training addresses such classroom topics as OSHA requirements, operator responsibilities, accident prevention, equipment inspection, boat-lifting and -blocking standards, job-site safety, lift planning, supervisor awareness, and rigging considerations. Long-time renowned ABBRA instructor Paul Doppke will be presenting the Straddlelift and Forklift sessions.

The fee for the MEOT in Marine Straddlelift or Forklift is \$150 per person. Registrants who opt to take both course will pay a reduced fee of \$275. All fees include course instruction, related course handouts, and a certificate of completion following successful completion of a written final exam.
